I was adopted into the House of Ruth family when my daughter was just a couple weeks from her first birthday. She is now six years-old and in the first grade; and has two little brothers enrolled at Kidspace. My journey started when I was ready to go back to work and needed a safe space for my daughter to go. At the time, I was going through a domestic violence situation and her safety was my only priority. My friend referred me to Kidspace, and I called them the same day. Mrs. Sharon, their Family Engagement Specialist, was my point of contact and has been like a second mother ever since. She made me feel so comfortable with her warm welcoming from our very first meeting.



We meet once a week and practice mindfulness techniques to help relieve our stress, anxiety, depression, and improve our overall mental health. It's a nojudgement zone. Even though I still attend individual therapy to work on myself, my healing circle is now a part of my village, and I am grateful for them.

The teachers and staff at Kidspace have been there for me and my children for many years. I have cried on their shoulders when times were tough and become excited to express my great news like going back to work or perfecting a new skill. The advice they give is always sincere and from the heart. They are so proud of my accomplishments and push me when I feel I've made mistakes. I am really surrounded by the best of the best.

When Brenda arrived at Kidspace in 2023, she had fled six years of abuse—with three children—the youngest just 7 months. After years of feeling invisible and isolated, she never dreamed of finding a welcoming community that would support both her and her children.

A teenager and pregnant, Brenda found herself estranged from her family—her only lifeline the father of her child. Over the next six years, Brenda began to realize that his "expressions of love" were actually abuse. Now with three children, she found her voice and her courage in a conversation with a compassionate stranger.

That stranger referred Brenda and her children to Kidspace.

Like many, Brenda came to Kidspace focused on childcare—professional staff in a beautiful, enriching environment. Over time and with many conversations, she discovered the network of support available to not only her children but also her. Kidspace became a lifeline, connecting her to financial literacy resources, mental health services, and developmental support for her children. With each day, Brenda grew stronger and more confident—realizing that she and her family were no longer invisible.

"I never thought any of this was possible," Brenda shared.

"Kidspace made me feel visible and important again. House of Ruth has no idea how much they've changed my life."


At Kidspace, Brenda found safety, security, and a sense of belonging. She is now enrolled in IT classes—setting a foundation for a stable and independent future. Her older children are thriving in private school. And she has a bold new plan: to purchase a home for her family within the next five years.

MedstarGeorgetown

Multi-Generational Mental Health Services

As of July 2022, mental health therapy is available onsite at Kidspace to both parents and children on an ongoing basis, thanks to our partnership with MedStar Georgetown Hospital Division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and the Early Childhood Innovation Network.

442 therapy sessions have been provided to parents and children since 2022. Services and programs offered include:





Supportive Learning Environment

Kidspace meets the psycho-social needs of vulnerable infants and children by providing trauma-informed care. Each new child undergoes a developmental assessment using the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ), and all students are screened once a year.

Therapists provide both 1:1 therapy and therapy in a classroom setting. The children's progress is monitored daily by their teacher and discussed frequently with each child's parents.



Creative Curriculum: Kidspace uses the highly regarded and well-researched Creative Curriculum for Preschool and the Creative Curriculum for Infants, Toddlers and Two's. It emphasizes fostering nurturing environments, play-based learning experiences, and hands-on investigation where students explore and discover at their own pace. In conjunction with the Creative Curriculum, Kidspace follows the District of Columbia Common Core Early Learning Standards.



Raising a Reader: Each week, every child takes home a bag with three to five books. When they bring back the bag, they are provided a new set of books.

FRESHFARM provides the produce for breakfast and lunch; cultivates an edible garden with the children; and hosts fun-filled cooking demonstrations.

Inspired Child bring arts education into Kidspace classrooms and provides teacher trainings. The 2024 residency included Dancing with Babies for infants and Rainbow dance for toddlers.
